Objective:

To understand the procedure of passage of bills and legislative process in the Parliament of India.

REPORT

Parliamentary session on passage of bill proposing two language policy i.e. compulsory teaching of Hindi in all schools.

The parliamentary session was conducted on Zoom. The bill that was proposed to be passed was introducing Hindi as compulsory language in all schools in India. The bill also states that the students will be at the liberty to choose their second language from amongst English or any other regional language.

The students were allotted various portfolios and were divided between government and opposition. Before the bill was tabled, the Prime Minister addressed the session and talked about the relevance of the bill. The bill was formally introduced by the Minister of Education. Various ministers of government such as Minister of Home affairs, Minister of Minority Affairs and Minister of State spoke about the eminence of such a bill; they substantiated their points legally and constitutionally. They were countered by members of opposition on factual and legal aspects. The session started at 11:15 AM and ended at 2:40 PM.



The judges ruled in favour of opposition and the Bill lapsed. The purpose of this exercise was to expose the students to the legislative functions of the Parliament and to let them gain practical knowledge on how bills are passed by the legislature.
