First best practices

1. Title of the Practice: Green Campus Initiative

2. Objectives of the Practice

To promote environment-friendly practices.

To strengthen the green cover in the campus

To reinforce the 'Reduce-Reuse-Recycle' campaign

To follow practices promoting green energy

To conserve non-renewable sources of energy

To promote the use of renewable energy

To adopt environment-friendly methods to dispose of waste

The practice adheres to the principles of the Sustainable Development Goals adopted by the Government of India. The major aim is to ensure that our current use of resources does not harm the environment or future generations.

3.The Context

Considering the rising industrialization and the associated issues of pollution and deforestation, the need was felt to follow sustainable methods of living. The Campus located in NCR where, due to high pollution, availability fresh air is a big challenge. The institution has been committed to raising a generation of environmentally-conscious individuals. Besides, being aware of the harm caused by the excessive use of plastic and

other non biodegradable materials, the College felt that it is necessary to inculcate environmental consciousness in the students and staff for a better tomorrow.

4.The Practice

The College launched various programmes to promote the Green Campus Initiative. Plastic has been banned in the campus and students and staff are encouraged to use cloth bags, steel bottles etc. The 'Reduce-Reuse-Recycle' programme has been functioning effectively and students are given training to make art out of trash and reuse items whenever possible. The Green Corner, selling organic snacks, is opened during fests.

Energy management programmes are also conducted. Awareness campaigns, seminars, workshops etc are organized to make the students environment-conscious.

5.Evidence of Success

The Green Campus Initiative has succeeded in creating environmental-consciousness among the students and staff. They take special efforts to protect the foliage in the campus and also focus on organic farming in their homes. The students and staff have stopped using plastic bottles and bags. Waste management, both in the college and outside, is done effectively. Activities are undertaken every year to make the campus environment and energy friendly.

Activities

1. Special care was taken to ensure that the plants may be conserved, grow well and more perennial plantation was done to produce fresh oxygen and absorption of more CO₂ in turn as well.
2. Energy Conservation Day Celebrations 2021 was organized by the Department of Mechanical Engineering and a series of activities were conducted from 1 December 2021 to 15 December 2021. 40 students participated in the events.
3. A slogan writing competition on "Energy and Environment Conservation" was conducted on 1 December 2020 and 23 students participated in the same.
4. A poster designing competition on the theme "Energy Advice for Your Home" was conducted to promote green practices at home.
5. An online webinar on "Energy Efficiency in Domestic Sectors" on 3 December 2021 to ensure the optimum use of resources was conducted

6. The College Installed Solar photovoltaic Cells on the roof top of all five buildings to extract sunlight as an alternative source of energy, this energy is being directly circulated through the power grid. .
7. Biodegradable matter was decomposed and non-biodegradable waste items were recycled and reused. Biodegradable plant is installed in the campus, all the organic waste is being decomposed organically by the micro-organism and it is being used as organic manure to nurture the plants of the institute. Non-biodegradable waste items are being collected by Greater Noida Development Authority, and GNIDA has installed a recycler where this waste is being recycled and re-used properly.
8. Promoted Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.
9. Conducted 'Mega Pollution Awareness Pakhwada' as part of Prime Ministers 'Swachh Bharat Yojana'
10. In order to make the campus plastic free, the use of plastic bottles was discouraged.
11. Teachers and students were encouraged to walk or cycle to college to conserve fossil fuels.
12. Reinforced 'Reduce-Reuse-Recycle Programme'.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Students were initially reluctant to dispose of plastic items and resort to more environment friendly materials. However, the volunteers made various items made of reusable materials available and all students now use plastic-free items. Many members were not willing to walk or cycle to College since they were used to coming by public/private vehicles. Awareness campaigns helped solved this issue. Students themselves were asked to conduct green audits and energy audits so that they would be able to understand the situation and tackle issues.

Second best practices

Legal Aid Cell

1. Title of the Practice: Legal Aid Society

2.Objectives of the Practice

1.To ensure justice to poor and marginalized sections of the society; An advocate is required to provide them legal assistance even when they are not in position either to pay him at all or adequately pay him for his services.

2. Right to Legal Aid in India: Free legal aid services have been set up to provide legal advice to the poor and the needy people. In India, there are a lot of poor people who are not able to earn their two times meal also. So for them, it is very difficult to afford an advocate for their case. So free legal aid is necessary for those people as it is written in our Indian constitution under Article 14 that all the people are equal to the justice should also be provided to the entire person whether he is

rich or poor. So free legal aid is given so that the poor who are not able to fight a case against a powerful or a rich person can also get justice

3. Legal representation: This means that the poor and the weaker section should also get the legal representative as they are also the citizen of India and it is our fundamental right to equality under Article 14 of the Constitution of India. So whether a person is rich or a poor he has the right to have a legal representative so that they can also get free legal aid from the government. It is written under Article 39A of the Constitution of India “Free legal aid *to all the citizen of India*”

4. Public education on legal matters to indigent people : This means that all the citizens of India should be aware of the basic rights ie, the fundamental rights which are provided to all the citizens of India so that they can exercise those powers in the court. These rights are also enforceable by the court of law.

Right to free legal aid has also become part of the fundamental rights. So the fundamental rights should be taught to the youth of our country who are the future of our country the legal rights so that no one can take advantage of it whether rich or poor.

All the citizens have the right to equality and equality before the law which is mentioned under article 14 of our Indian constitution.

3.The Context

Legal aid is the provision of assistance to people who are unable to afford legal representation and access to the court system. Legal aid is regarded as central in providing access to justice by ensuring equality before the law, the right to counsel and the right to a fair trial.

4.The Practice

One of the best practices at JEMTEC School of Law is the functioning of legal aid society for community services. This society is basically committed to provide justice to the masses. The committee is constituted of our own students with a strength of 70 students of second to fourth year of B.A., LL.B., and B.B.A.LL.B. courses. The legal aid society is supervised by four faculty members under the guidance and supervision of District Legal Aid Services.

The committee has undertaken So many programmes since 2014 eg ; Legal awareness program, Sanitary pad distribution, Jail visit, Social services like sanitary pad distribution, Police Station visit, Visit to lok adalat, Adoption of a village to make it litigation free, School visits for awareness, Para legal volunteers, Free education to children living in slum areas etc.

5. Evidence of Success

Recent progress has been made in understanding the extent of legal problems, including the kinds of groups most in need of legal aid, the reasons why legal needs remain unmet, and the barriers that people encounter to access justice. legal aid focus on everyday legal needs, which also happen to be predominantly civil in nature. In housing for instance, the most frequently cited legal needs relate to evictions, foreclosure, utility payment issues, unsafe housing conditions and homelessness. Family legal needs generally include divorce, domestic violence, child custody, visitation, maintenance and alimony, and division of family assets. Depending on the context, access to criminal legal aid, especially in the early stages of the criminal justice process, such as pre-trial detention, is found to be essential for poor and marginalized groups, who are often unaware of their legal rights and lack the resources to obtain legal advice or representation. These issues were addressed successfully by our legal aid society.

Activities:

So many activities were undertaken under the aegis of this legal aid society such as:

Legal awareness program: - This programme is the flagship programme of our legal aid society. The idea is to give elementary knowledge of law to each and every citizen living in our area so that our citizens are able to protect their rights at the right time. This will lead to the legal knowledge of our citizens. Their human rights will not go unaddressed if they are aware about their rights.



Sanitary pad distribution: - The society conducts a sanitary pad distribution programme for the ladies. The idea is to provide gender sensitization amongst the masses. This programme aims at providing right to health and hygiene to the ladies folk.



Jail visit: - This is an important function of the legal aid society to provide immediate justice to the under trials and convicted persons who are lodged in different jails. It includes the interaction with the jail inmates. If a detainee is poor and cannot afford a lawyer, then our society members draft applications on behalf of such down trodden and illiterate members of the community. Their cases are represented by this society in the subordinate courts as well as in the High Court and even in the Supreme Court so as to provide quick justice to such needy sections of the society.



Police station visit: - The purpose of visit of a police station is not only to educate the members of the society, but also to have interaction with the working of the Police and the procedure to be followed by the police after lodging of the FIR. The

society keeps an eye upon the functioning of the police so as to ensure that there is no violation of human rights at the Police station.



Visit to Lok Adalat: - This is another very important functioning of the legal aid society. Our students visit at the court compound on usual days as well as on the days when Lok Adalat is organized. The committee members help the litigants in resolving their disputes especially by means of conciliation and arbitration. We take up the family disputes between husband and wife and try to unite the departed couples. The society specially takes up the cases which involve the custody of young children keeping in mind that the interest of the child is of paramount importance.



Adoption of a village to make it litigation free: - The society frequently adopts a village to make it litigation free. The members of the society provide justice at the door step in the village itself. This step is highly appreciated by the villagers. This

programme is organized in collaboration with DLSA of G. B. Nagar. The society takes the help of village Pradhans and village barristers to resolve the disputes between the villagers.



School visits for awareness: - The members of the committee frequently visits various schools in the vicinity of our college for providing legal education to the students of 8th standard onwards. The idea is to train those students for joining law stream in the future and to make them aware regarding the fundamentals enshrined in our Constitution.



Para legal volunteers: - Our students are appointed by DLSA, G. B. Nagar as para legal volunteers. The DLSA arranges for their training in the field of law. After this training, our students are made well equipped with nuances of law and legal system so that they can help others in protection of their rights.



Free education to children living in slum areas: - In order to fulfill the directive principle of state policy of providing free and compulsory education to the children between 6 to 14 years of age, the society members use to visit slum areas in nearby places and provide free education to the poor and needy sections of the society. Our members encourage the people living in slum areas to go to the school. Society takes care of those who have dropped their education in between.



Food donation and distribution drive: - This drive arranged by the society takes care about the right to health of the under nourished sections of the society. Our society members visit the villages and slum areas to feed the hungry boys and girls. The food is donated by the faculty members and students. Food is provided to the needy persons in packets. They are made aware about the hygiene to keep up their good health.



Self-defense program for women: - This programme arranged by the society aims at the protection of the females at their own. The women folk is trained by the experts as to how to exercise the right of their self-defense in an effective manner so that none could exploit the women folk.



Juvenile home visit: - The visit to juvenile home is also arranged by this society for protection of the children. The Children are provided necessary help in order to have reached before the appropriate forum in time. The society also keeps an eye upon the hygiene to be maintained in juvenile homes and ensure that there is no sexual harassment of the inmates inside or outside the juvenile homes.



Old Cloth donation drive: - This drive aims at providing new as well as used cloths to the needy sections of the society. Theses cloths are generally donated by our own faculty and staff members. The cloths are distributed to the children and ladies living in the slum areas.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Two-thirds of the world's population—lack meaningful access to justice. Lack of access to justice traps people in vicious cycles of poverty, inequality and marginalization. The burden of this justice gap falls disproportionately on the most vulnerable, including women, children, minorities and people with disabilities. Lack of access to justice also increases the risk of conflict and violence within a society. Initially, when our students start interaction with the local people to assist them on their legal issues they were hesitant to disclose their issues before them. At some point we may need an attorney, but feel like we can't afford one.
