2. Introduction

In an era of rapid urbanization and escalating environmental degradation, the need for proactive green initiatives has never been more urgent. JIMS Engineering Management Technical Campus, Greater Noida, through its Departments of Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning (AIML), Artificial Intelligence & Data Science (AIDS), and Computer Science & Technology (CST), took a commendable step towards environmental stewardship by organizing a Plantation Drive on campus grounds.

The initiative was conceived with the dual objective of enriching the campus ecosystem and instilling a sense of ecological responsibility among the student and faculty community. By embedding sustainability into the academic environment, the departments sought to demonstrate that technological advancement and environmental consciousness can and must go hand in hand.

3. Objectives of the Drive

The Plantation Drive was undertaken with the following key objectives:

- To increase the green cover of the JIMSEMC campus and improve its ecological aesthetics.
- To raise awareness among students, faculty, and staff about the importance of trees in combating climate change.
- To foster a sense of civic responsibility and environmental citizenship among the academic community.
- To align institutional activities with the national and global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 13 (Climate Action) and SDG 15 (Life on Land).
- To create a living, breathing green environment that promotes mental well-being and academic productivity.
- To commemorate the occasion as an annual tradition of environmental engagement for all three departments.

4. Planning & Organization

The event was meticulously planned under the guidance of the Heads of Departments of AIML, AIDS, and CST. A dedicated organizing committee comprising faculty members and student volunteers was formed well in advance to oversee all logistical and operational aspects of the drive.

4.1 Pre-Event Preparations

- Selection and procurement of suitable saplings — including neem, peepal, ashoka, gulmohar, and bougainvillea — from certified nurseries.
- Identification of planting zones across the campus — including the entrance corridor, the academic block periphery, the sports ground boundary, and the hostel garden area.
- Arrangement of gardening tools such as spades, trowels, watering cans, and protective gloves.
- Dissemination of awareness circulars and digital invitations to all students and faculty members.
- Formation of student volunteer teams, each assigned to a specific planting zone.

4.2 Roles & Responsibilities

The organizing committee was structured as follows:

- Faculty Coordinators (AIML, AIDS, CST): Overall supervision, logistics, and documentation.
- Student Volunteer Teams: Digging, planting, watering, and labeling of saplings.
- Campus Maintenance Staff: Ground preparation, soil conditioning, and post-event upkeep.
- Photography & Documentation Cell: Capturing the event for official records and social media outreach.

5. Event Proceedings

The Plantation Drive commenced at 10:00 AM on the designated day with an inaugural address by the Principal/Director of JIMSEMC, who emphasized the institution's unwavering commitment to creating a sustainable and green campus. The Heads of Departments of AIML, AIDS, and CST also addressed the gathering, inspiring participants to take ownership of the environment around them.

Following the inaugural session, the ceremonial first sapling was planted by the Principal, symbolically marking the beginning of a greener chapter for the campus. Subsequently, students, faculty, and staff were guided to their respective planting zones, where they proceeded with the drive under the supervision of faculty coordinators and campus gardeners.

Each participant was briefed on the correct technique for planting saplings — including proper hole depth, root placement, soil compaction, and initial watering — to ensure maximum survival rates. Informational placards bearing the name, species, and ecological benefit of each plant were affixed near the saplings.

The drive concluded with a collective pledge by all participants to actively protect and nurture the saplings planted, and to serve as ambassadors of environmental sustainability within their communities.

6. Participation & Engagement

The Plantation Drive witnessed enthusiastic and widespread participation from the JIMSEMC academic community. The breakdown of participants is outlined below:

7. Outcomes & Impact

The Plantation Drive yielded significant and multifaceted outcomes:

- Over 110 saplings of diverse species were successfully planted across the campus.
- The campus green cover is projected to increase by approximately 15-20% over the coming years as the saplings mature.
- More than 200 members of the academic community actively participated, fostering a shared sense of ownership and environmental responsibility.
- The event generated significant traction on the institution's social media channels, amplifying the message of environmental stewardship.
- The activity provided students with hands-on exposure to ecological practices, complementing their academic curriculum.
- The drive reinforced the institution's commitment to SDG-aligned campus development.

8. Future Plans & Follow-Up

The departments have resolved to institutionalize the Plantation Drive as an annual flagship event, ideally coinciding with World Environment Day (June 5th) or Van Mahotsav Week. The following measures have been planned to ensure the sustainability of the initiative:

- Assigning each planted sapling to a student guardian responsible for its watering and maintenance throughout the academic year.
- Installing QR-code-embedded plaques near saplings to track growth data and species information.
- Scaling the drive to involve all departments of JIMSEMC in subsequent editions.
- Establishing a campus Eco-Club jointly managed by the AIML, AIDS, and CST departments.
- Collaborating with local municipal bodies and NGOs for expanded green belt development in the surrounding areas.

9. Conclusion

The Plantation Drive organized by the Departments of AIML, AIDS, and CST at JIMS Engineering Management Technical Campus, Greater Noida, was a resounding success — both in terms of ecological impact and community participation. The initiative not only contributed tangibly to the greening of the

campus but also served as a powerful reminder that every individual action, no matter how small, contributes to a larger collective good.

As future engineers and technologists, the students of JIMSEMC demonstrated that innovation and sustainability are not mutually exclusive — and that the leaders of tomorrow are equally committed to healing the planet as they are to advancing technology. The institution remains steadfast in its resolve to nurture not just academic excellence, but also a culture of environmental mindfulness and responsible citizenship.

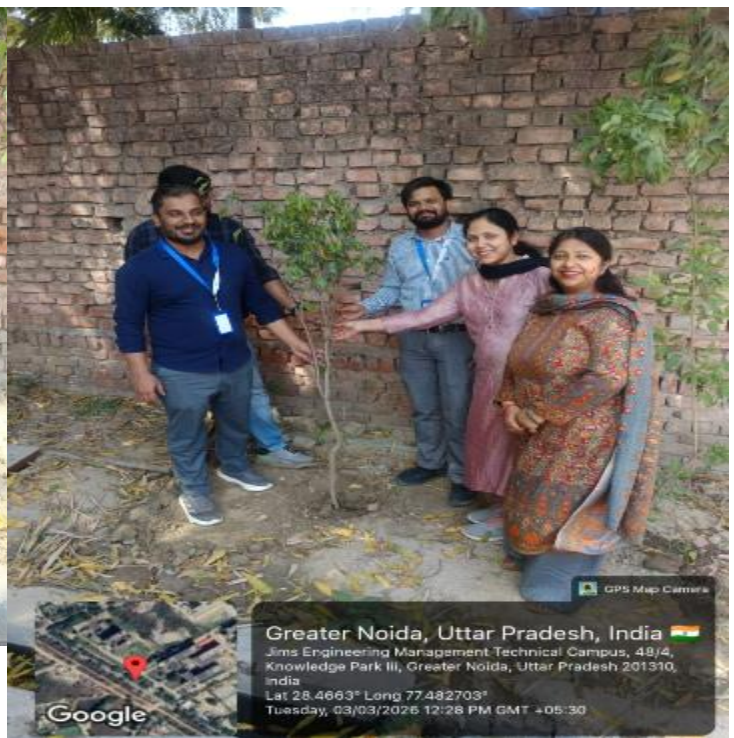
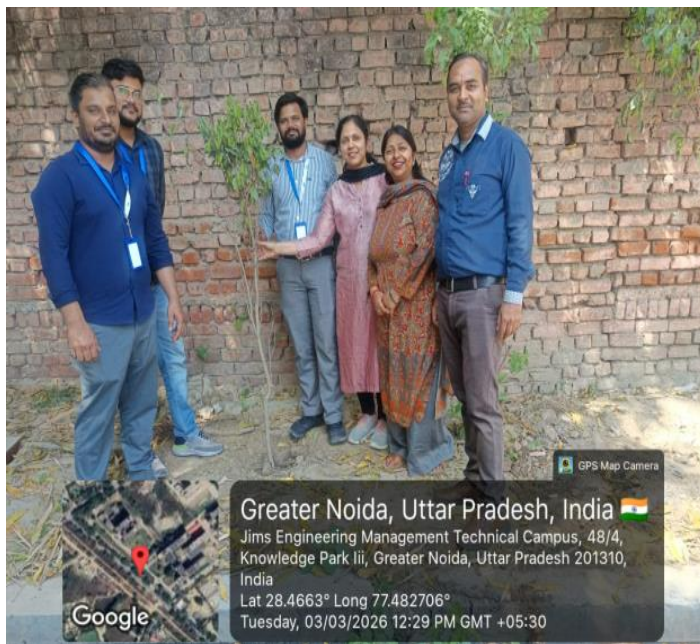


